

4. The Vicarage

*"The old Parsonage or Curate's house, situate at Castle Hill, (Rastrick) was erected in the year 1626, but became so much decayed and delapidated as to become altogether uninhabitable; and in the year 1840 it was taken down, and on one part of the site a dwelling house has been erected."*¹

The original **vicarage** (formerly known as the Parsonage House) on Ogden Lane (opposite the former Rastrick Grammar School / Independent School) was erected in 1807 by public subscription and enlarged in 1871/ 72 at a cost of £700.

The **present vicarage** on Vicarage Gardens was built in 1985/86 on church glebe land.

The glebe land was sold in part to a developer and as part of the 'deal' the Vicarage and the Archdeacon's house to the south were built at minimal cost to the Diocese. The developer was able to build two more properties on the glebe land to the south of the Archdeacon's house
